Comanche	Comanche County opted out of the state mask order. READ MORE	✓																	
Cowley	Effective until rescinded, Cowley County extended Phase Three of the Ad Astra Plan with the following modifications as amended: outdoor mass gatherings of more than 750 individuals are prohibited; indoor social gatherings of more than 300 individuals are prohibited or 25 percent of rated occupancy rate of the building so long as adequate social distancing can occur; indoor, on-site operations are limited to no more than 150 individuals. READ MORE On July 3, Cowley County opted out of the state mask order. READ MORE Effective for the duration of the 2020-2021 school year, all individuals wishing to enter any school venues or buildings including sports stadiums or game sites must properly wear a protective mask or face-covering as follows: when standing in lines at gates, restrooms or concession areas; when entering or exiting the facilities as part of a crowd; when seated in areas outdoors (including stadiums & fields) where adequate social distancing cannot be maintained; when inside school buildings for any reason; and when attending indoor school events including sports. Crawford	Effective until rescinded, Crawford County has a mass gathering limit of 50 people. All front line staff who are in contact with the public or are involved with food or drink prep or delivery are required to wear masks. All restaurants and bars are limited to seated areas only, consumption of food and beverages shall only take place while seated, and dance floors shall be closed; all parties must be place at least six feet apart from other seated parties, or when that is not feasible a barrier shall divide booths or tables. Event centers/community events must adhere to social distancing guidelines and the wearing of cloth masks is required, and the entity organizing the event is responsible for submitting a remediation plan to the Health Department one week prior to the event. Law enforcement officers are ordered to assist in enforcement of this order and any business failing to comply with any of the above requirements may face further limitations of business service up to and including closure of business. Any business closed pursuant to this order but submit a remediation plan to the health department and be inspected before reopening. Decatur	Decatur County passed a resolution opting out of the state mask order. READ MORE	✓																	
Dickinson	Effective until rescinded, Dickinson County requires essential businesses to screen employees for fevers or illness with a questionnaire at workplace entrance and move workspaces 6 feet apart. Restaurants and bars must adhere to social distancing guidelines; wait lines must adhere to social distancing guidelines or patrons must wait in vehicles. Retail businesses must maintain social distancing. Long-term care facilities must not allow outside visitors, maintain social distancing, adjust layout to maintain 6 feet between residents, perform enhanced cleanings daily and screen employees for fevers or illness, and any non-staff entrance to facility shall be documented. Childcare facilities must adhere to KDHE guidelines, perform enhanced cleanings daily and screen employees and children. Personal services may only be provided via appointment, service providers and customers shall wear masks, maintain social distancing of patrons and staff, providers must allow time for cleaning between appointments and follow industry guidelines. Gyms/fitness centers must adhere to social distancing guidelines, clean equipment between uses, and customers must be screened for fever or illness. Community events must maintain social distancing guidelines. Cruise nights, events, vehicle shows are permitted with social distancing. Graduation ceremonies allowed with approval of health department and county health officer. READ MORE Dickinson County also chose to uphold the state mask order. 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Doniphan	Doniphan County passed a resolution opting out of the state mask order. READ MORE	✓																
Douglas	Effective until rescinded, Douglas County prohibits mass gatherings of more than 45 individuals. All businesses must maintain at least six feet of distance between customers or groups of customers or use physical barriers sufficient to prevent virus spread between seated customers or groups of seated customers, follow fundamental cleaning and public health practices, and avoid any instances in which groups of more than 45 individuals are in one location and unable to maintain a 6-foot distance. Restaurants and bars with liquor licenses must also cease serving alcohol at 11pm and shall close no later than 12am. Entertainment Venues (nightclubs, dance halls, and similar businesses, including businesses that are BYOB) are permitted to be open subject to an occupancy limitation of a maximum of one hundred (100) people, provided Social Distancing Requirements and/or Face Mask Requirements are maintained. All activities, venues, and community centers can open if they comply with social distancing, cleaning, and limit groups to less than 45 individuals. Recreational, youth or other non-professional organized sports facilities, sports tournaments, sports games, and sports practices may open or occur if they follow guidelines established by the Lawrence-Douglas County Health Department. Individuals must wear mask or face coverings while inside – or in line to enter – any indoor public space, obtaining services from the healthcare sector in settings, waiting for or riding on public transportation, and while outdoors in public spaces where social distancing cannot be maintained. Geary	Effective until October 18, Geary County requires masks to be worn in all businesses, organizations and non-profit associations when employees are working in any space where food is prepared or packaged for sale or distribution of others; and employees are in an area where social distance cannot be maintained. All businesses and locations are required to comply with CDC and industry-specific guidance. All restaurants and bars shall screen each employee before each shift, and include asking about symptoms, travel, contact, and checking temperatures. Bars and restaurants/dine-in are limited to seated areas only and dance floors shall be closed. Special events must submit paperwork to the Health Department seven days prior to the event and develop an infection control plan with the Health Department to be approved by the Local Health Officer. Wyandotte	<p>Effective until rescinded, Wyandotte County remains in Phase Three of the Ad Astra Plan with the following modifications: swimming pool capacity is limited to no more than 45; summer camps, fairs, festivals and outdoor venues are allowed at 50 percent or less of Fire Marshal approved capacity, and only if proper 6 ft social distancing can be maintained if there are more than 45 individuals in one place. Visitors are not allowed at long term care facilities or correctional facilities. Enforcement pursuant to K.S.A. 65-129b and penalty is a Class C Misdemeanor punishable by a maximum fine of \$500 and a 30-day jail sentence. READ MORE</p> <p>Wyandotte County continues to mandate the wearing of masks, with the following additional requirements added July 14: athletes and those exercising indoors are required to wear masks; all children over 5 years of age and all staff in daycare/childcare/educational settings are required to wear masks unless actively eating, drinking, or sleeping. READ MORE</p> <p>In-person classes at public schools within Wyandotte County's jurisdiction cannot begin until after Labor Day, and all children and educators must wear masks while inside and in outdoor groups. Effective August 14, sponsoring competitions in the following sports and activities during the 2020 fall sports season: football, volleyball, soccer, and band are hereby prohibited. Emporia	Lyon	Effective until rescinded, the City of Emporia enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punished by a fine of \$25 upon a first conviction, by a fine of \$50 upon a second conviction, and by fine of \$100 upon a third or subsequent conviction, plus court costs. READ MORE
Hays	Ellis	Effective until until such time that there is a seven-day average of new cases of COVID-19 per day in Ellis County of 5 or fewer for 14 consecutive days as reported by the Ellis County Local Health Officer or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency relating to COVID-19 mitigation measures lapses or is revoked or rescinded, whichever occurs first, the City of Hays enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: children ages 8 and younger are exempt; a violation shall be punished by a fine of \$25 upon a first conviction, by a fine \$50 upon a second conviction, and by fine of \$100 upon a third or subsequent conviction, plus court costs. Manhattan	Riley	Effective through December 31, the City of Manhattan enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the statewide mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punished as follows with a fine of \$5 for the first conviction, with a fine of \$10 for the second conviction and with a fine of \$20 for the third or subsequent violation. Marion	Marion	Effective until December 31, the City of Marion enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: for a person, firm or corporation, the first conviction shall be punished by a fine of \$25, second conviction by a fine of \$50, and third or subsequent conviction by a fine of \$100. Osawatomie	Miami	Effective until rescinded, the City of Osawatomie enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punished by a fine of no less than \$25 upon a first conviction, by a fine of no less than \$50 upon a second conviction and by a fine of no less than \$100 upon a third or subsequent violation. READ MORE
Paola	Miami	Effective until rescinded, the City of Paola enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punished by a fine of no less than \$25 upon a first conviction, by a fine of no less than \$50 upon a second conviction and by a fine of no less than \$100 upon a third or subsequent violation. READ MORE
Parsons	Labette	Effective until rescinded, the City of Parsons enacted an ordinance similar to the state mask order with the following modifications: no age exemption, a violation by an individual shall be punished with a warning for the first offense, with a \$15 fee for the second offense, and a third offense could be fined \$50 plus \$90 in court costs. An amendment was passed on August 4 exempting persons age 5 years and under and not requiring students attending schools to comply as long as students follow mask policy issued by their school administration. Salina	Saline	Effective until rescinded, the City of Salina enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: any person, business, organization, or non-profit association violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of no less than \$25.00 upon a first violation, a fine of no less than \$50.00 upon a second violation, and a fine of no less than one hundred \$100.00 upon a third or subsequent violation. Each occurrence of a violation of this ordinance shall be considered a separate and distinct violation. READ MORE
Wichita	Sedgwick	Effective until October 21 or the Sedgwick County area hospital status assessment moves from yellow to green and the Sedgwick County rolling 14 day average rate of positive tests reaches less than five percent, the City of Wichita enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: for a person, firm or corporation, the first conviction shall be punished by a fine of \$25, second conviction by a fine of \$50, and third or subsequent conviction by a fine of \$100. READ MORE
Winfield	Cowley	Effective until rescinded, the City of Winfield enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the statewide mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding \$25 for the first violation; not exceeding \$50 for the second violation and not exceeding \$100 for each additional violation. READ MORE
