Stanton	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • Effective April 5, the Stanton County Board of Commissioners adopted a resolution rescinding the previous mask order and mass gathering resolution. READ MORE															
Stevens	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On November 24, the Stevens County Commission passed a resolution not requiring individuals to wear masks. READ MORE															
Sumner	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On November 23, the Sumner County Commission passed a resolution opting out of the second state mask order. READ MORE															
Thomas	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On November 23, the Thomas County Commission passed a resolution opting out of the second state mask order. READ MORE															
Trego	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On November 24, the Trego County Commission passed a resolution opting out of the second state mask order. READ MORE															
Wabaunsee	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On March 15, Wabaunsee County Commission passed an order encouraging masks, but not requiring them. READ MORE															
Wallace	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On November 24, the Wallace County Commission passed a resolution opting out of the second state mask order. READ MORE															
Washington	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • Washington County did not impose a local mask order after the state mask order ended on March 31.															
Wichita	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On November 23, the Wichita County Commission passed a resolution opting out of the second state mask order. READ MORE															
Wilson	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On December 30, the Wilson County Commission repealed the local mask order, which had mandated masks to be worn in indoor and outdoor public spaces where social distancing cannot be maintained and when waiting for transportation. READ MORE															
Woodson	No mask order or local restrictions in place. • On November 24, the Woodson County Commission passed a resolution opting out of the second state mask order. READ MORE															
Wyandotte	Local mask order in place. • On March 25, the Wyandotte County Commission passed a new mask mandate that requires all people to wear masks in public spaces and requires businesses to require employees to wear masks. This resolution includes an enforcement mechanism of a \$500 fine and possible jail sentence for violations. READ MORE Local restrictions in place. • On March 11, the Public Health Officer issued a Local Health Order mandating that all school children and educators must wear masks at all times and socially distance. Students must be cohorted to limit contact. On February 25, the Public Health Officer issued another Local Health Order allowing businesses to open at their normal operating hours as long as they limit occupancy to 50% of the fire code legal limit. Concordia	Cloud	The Concordia City Commission enacted an ordinance requiring masks be worn in public spaces and the enforcement of quarantine and isolation orders. Violating of the ordinance will be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of \$25 plus court costs for a first violation, \$50 plus court costs for a second violation and \$100 plus court costs upon a third or subsequent violation. Lindsborg	McPherson	Effective until rescinded by City Council action, the City of Lindsborg enacted Ordinance No.5267 requiring masks in public. Any person, firm, or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine \$25 for a first conviction, \$50 for a second conviction, and \$100 upon a third or subsequent conviction. READ MORE
Lyons	Rice	Effective until rescinded, the Lyons City Commission enacted an ordinance adding a new section to the city code which requires face mask in public spaces. Violation of the mask requirement is an infraction is punished by a \$10 fine per occurrence. Court costs are not levied. READ MORE
Manhattan	Riley	On December 1, the Manhattan City Commission approved an extension of the mask ordinance until April 1. On March 16, 2021, the Manhattan City Commission voted to extend the ordinance to May 16, 2021. Previously, effective through December 31, the City of Manhattan enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the statewide mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punished as follows with a fine of \$5 for the first conviction, with a fine of \$10 for the second conviction and with a fine of \$20 for the third or subsequent violation. Marion	Marion	On December 28, the City of Marion passed Ordinance No. 1469 extending the mask requirement to June 30. Previously, effective until December 31, the City of Marion enacted an ordinance to update the city code with language nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: for a person, firm or corporation, the first conviction shall be punished by a fine of \$25, second conviction by a fine of \$50, and third or subsequent conviction by a fine of \$100. READ MORE
Marysville	Marshall	On January 11, the Governing Body of the City of Marysville enacted ordinance 1896 requiring masks in public until April 1. The ordinance was extended through May 1. Previously, effective through January 17, the Governing Body of the City of Marysville enacted ordinance No. 1894 requiring masks in public. A person found in violation of the ordinance shall be punished with a fine of \$20, while a business shall be punished with a fine of \$50. No court costs shall be assessed as a result of conviction. READ MORE
McPherson	McPherson	On October 26, the Governing Body of the City of McPherson enacted Ordinance No. 3324 requiring masks be work in public spaces. Any person violating the ordinance shall be fine \$10 per occurrence. READ MORE
Osawatomie	Miami	Effective until rescinded, the City of Osawatomie enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punished by a fine of no less than \$25 upon a first conviction, by a fine of no less than \$50 upon a second conviction and by a fine of no less than \$100 upon a third or subsequent violation. READ MORE
Paola	Miami	Effective until rescinded, the City of Paola enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the state mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punished by a fine of no less than \$25 upon a first conviction, by a fine of no less than \$50 upon a second conviction and by a fine of no less than \$100 upon a third or subsequent violation. READ MORE
Parsons	Labette	Effective until rescinded, the City of Parsons enacted an ordinance similar to the state mask order with the following modifications: no age exemption, a violation by an individual shall be punished with a warning for the first offense, with a \$15 fee for the second offense, and a third offense could be fined \$50 plus \$90 in court costs. An amendment was passed on August 4 exempting persons age 5 years and under and not requiring students attending schools to comply as long as students follow mask policy issued by their school administration. READ MORE
Salina	Saline	On November 23, the City of Salina enacted ordinance No. 20-11045 requiring masks be work in public spaces. Any person, business, organization, or non-profit association violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of no less than \$25.00 upon a first violation, a fine of no less than \$50.00 upon a second violation, and a fine of no less than one hundred \$100.00 upon a third or subsequent violation. Each occurrence of a violation of this ordinance shall be considered a separate and distinct violation. READ MORE
Tonganoxie	Leavenworth	On January 19, the Tonganoxie City Council enacted ordinance #1493, requiring mask be worn in public spaces until April 14. Any violation of any provision of the ordinance shall be punished by a fine \$5 for a first conviction, \$10 for a second conviction, and \$20 upon a third or subsequent conviction. READ MORE
Winfield	Cowley	Effective until rescinded, the City of Winfield enacted an ordinance nearly identical to the statewide mask order with the following modifications: a violation shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding \$25 for the first violation; not exceeding \$50 for the second violation and not exceeding \$100 for each additional violation. READ MORE
