<a href="#">Clay</a>	Effective until June 8, Clay County adopted Phase Three of the Ad Astra Plan. All businesses, activities and venues may open if they can maintain 6 feet of distance, and fundamental cleaning and public health practices and avoid instances in which groups of more than 45 are in one location. Licensed childcare facilities may reopen or continue operations pursuant to state and local regulations. Playground equipment, picnic tables, benches and other commonly used surfaces may reopen at the discretion of the city or county that owns the park following industry guidance. Swimming pools may open at the discretion of the owner within outlined guidance. Cruising is allowed within social distancing and mass gathering limitations.	✓	✓							✓			✓
<a href="#">Cloud</a>	Effective until June 7, mass gatherings are limited to no more than 15 individuals. Restaurants, bars and night clubs must place tables six feet apart and limit 15 people to a table or group. Booths must have solid material (e.g., plexiglass) separating it from booths in front and behind. Self-service food stations, buffets and drink fountains are prohibited through at least June 8. Personal service businesses are open for pre-scheduled appointments and online check-in, with only one customer per station allowed. For personal service providers, waiting rooms at personal service businesses remain closed, masks will be worn by employees and customers, social distancing and intermittent contact and each work station will be sanitized between customers. Fitness center and health club locker rooms must be closed, except to use as restroom facilities, equipment will be sanitized following each use and no more than 15 people are allowed in a room. Baseball, softball, t-ball and K-18 teams can practice and play games if equipment is properly sanitized. Indoor leisure spaces can reopen but must adhere to social distancing requirements and cleaning and public health practices. Indoor graduation ceremonies are limited to no more than 15 individuals in a room, and outdoor drive-through ceremonies are limited to no more than 15 individuals in the same area outside of their vehicles.	✓	✓	✓		✓	✓	✓		✓

<a href="#">Cowley</a>	Effective until June 15, Cowley County has adopted Phase Three of the Ad Astra Plan with the following modifications: outdoor mass gatherings of more than 250 individuals are prohibited; indoor mass gatherings of more than 150 individuals are prohibited; indoor, on-site operations are limited to no more than 100 individuals.	✓	✓							✓

<a href="#">Dickinson</a>	Effective until June 8, mass gatherings are not limited, but attendees must be logged at events with 50+ individuals. Essential businesses, restaurants, retail businesses, gyms and fitness centers, community events and long-term care facilities must comply with social distancing guidelines, making adjustments to facilities as needed. Retail businesses must provide shopping cart sanitation. Childcare facilities must adhere to KDHE guidelines. Gyms/fitness centers and personal service providers must screen and keep a record of customers. Gyms and fitness centers must clean equipment between uses. Personal services can only be provided via appointment, only one customer per provider is allowed at once, service providers and customers must wear masks and providers must allow time for cleaning between appointments. Community events, including graduations, are allowed so long as they follow mass gathering restrictions (i.e., logging attendees at events of 50+).	✓			✓	✓	✓						
<a href="#">Doniphan</a>	Effective until June 15, mass gatherings of more than 45 individuals are prohibited. All businesses, activities, and venues can open if maintain 6 feet of social distance, follow fundamental cleaning and public health practices, and avoid instances in which groups of 45 individuals are in one location and are unable to maintain a 6-foot distance physical distance. Childcare facilities may reopen or continue operations pursuant to state and local regulations.	✓	✓							✓			





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<a href="#">Morris</a>	Effective until June 8, Morris County has adopted Phase Two of the Ad Astra Plan, with the following modifications: self-service food and beverages and buffets are prohibited; services provided at hair salons and barber shops is by appointment only, only one customer per service provider at once; only one customer is allowed per vendor at a time at farmers markets and social distancing must be observed; gym and fitness center locker rooms remain closed except to use as restroom facilities; and recreation activities and organized sports must follow mass gathering and social distancing guidelines.	✓	✓	✓		✓	✓	✓	✓	✓	✓

<a href="#">Republic</a>	Effective until rescinded, Republic County has adopted Phase Three of the Ad Astra Plan with the following modifications: mass gatherings of more than 75 individuals are prohibited; restaurants can operate dine-in services and bars and night clubs can open at 75 percent capacity, so long as they adhere to social distancing, groups of customers do not exceed 75, and self-service or buffet style dining is prohibited; fitness center and gym locker rooms must remain closed except as restroom facilities, equipment will be sanitized after each use and mass gathering restrictions must be adhered to; for personal services, service providers and customers must wear masks, appointments must be spaced to allow for cleaning between customers and only one customer per service provider is allowed at a time. <a href="#">Wilson</a>	Effective through June 14, at minimum, mass gatherings of more than 90 individuals are prohibited. Restaurants, professional photography, garage sales, community centers, golf course clubhouses and patios, public swimming pools, personal classes (e.g., dance classes), in-person meetings and conferences, education, community events (e.g., festivals, parades), must adhere to mass gathering limit and social distancing. Retail businesses and organized community cruising events must adhere to mass gathering guidance. Pet grooming facilities, golf course properties, libraries, gyms/fitness centers must adhere to social distancing guidelines. Childcare facilities must adhere to KDHE guidelines. Groups playing golf together are limited to 10 people (including observers). <a href="#">Wyandotte</a>	Effective until June 8, Wyandotte County has adopted Phase Two of the Ad Astra Plan, with the following modifications: bars and night clubs can open if mass gathering limits are met, staff wear masks, hand sanitizer is available and staff clean surfaces regularly. Public buildings in Wyandotte County are open by appointment only, and visitors are screened upon entry and required to wear masks.
