

CONTRASTING RATES

Hispanic and Black infant mortality rates rose to 2-3 times more than the rate for White infants in Shawnee County.



Why this is important: Infant death is a relatively rare event in most counties. Nationally, thousands of infants die per year from causes such as low birth weight, congenital malformations, and sudden infant death syndrome. Significant health disparities exist, particularly for Black infants in Kansas, who had three times the infant mortality rate (13.6 deaths per 1,000 live births) than White infants (4.5 deaths per 1,000 live births) in 2021. Keeping infants healthy begins with access to high-quality care during pregnancy. The Healthy People 2030 goal is to decrease the rate of infant deaths to 5.0 per 1,000 live births.
