## **Expanding the Lifeline in Kansas**

The 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline has answered over 10 million calls across the country since its launch in July 2022. Year two has seen an over 25 percent increase in calls and approximately 45 percent increase in chat and text demand from the previous year. In addition to an increase in volume, investments into the network also have grown with more than \$200 million in federal grants awarded in 2024, of which Kansas received \$5.4 million over three years.




Texts and chats to 988 saw an over 100 percent increase in volume from July 2023 to July 2024.

## **Number of 988 Calls Answered In-State**



Calls answered in-state remained steady during the first year of the 988 Lifeline, with a 2-percent increase. In year two, there was nearly a 70 percent increase over the 12-month period.

## **Number of 988 Texts and Chats Routed**



While the first year saw a demand for chat and text increase by approximately 52 percent, year two saw continued growth, with over a 110-percent increase over the 12-month period.
