




Insurance Coverage in Kansas



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Sources of Insurance Coverage, 2023










Uninsured Rate by State, 2023



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Uninsured Kansans

Age

 Nearly 4 in 10 (39.6 percent) were aged 26-44, and more than a quarter (27.2 percent) were age 45-64.

Family Income


 More than three-quarters (78.8 percent) had income above the poverty line (\$30,000 for a family of four in 2023).

Race and Ethnicity

• 3 in 10 (34.1 percent) were Hispanic, any race.




Uninsured Rate by Race and Ethnicity


Uninsured Rate by Race and Ethnicity

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


